Saudi Arabia is a country on the cusp of huge economic and social change, with big ambitions to increase investment, diversify its industries, and equip its people to succeed in the decades ahead.

This includes kick-starting a program of major infrastructure projects unrivaled in scale and scope — that will transform its landscape, and place Saudi Arabia at the forefront of the digital revolution.

In terms of overall value, Saudi Arabia's Public Investment Fund (PIF), which is at the heart of Saudi Vision 2030, aims to increase its portfolio of assets to over US\$2 trillion by 2030, greater than site spanning an archipelago of more the GDP of Canada or Russia.

On the ground, this translates into plans for three new giga-cities -NEOM, Qiddiya and the Red Sea Development — as well as to upgrade core infrastructure throughout the country, combining the ancient with the new in cities, such as Makkah City.

These projects are unlike anything else globally or professionally.

NEOM will build a new global economic hub - to compete against the world's leading financial centers in size, trade and innovation.

Qiddiya aims to become Saudi Arabia's pre-eminent entertainment, sports and cultural destination.


While the Red Sea Development will create a luxury tourist resort, with a than 90 islands and 200 kilometers of coast line that includes volcanoes. beaches and canyons.

It's always a big step to move to another country. You need to know that it will be worth it, for you and those you care for.

Financially rewarding

For many, financially, this is a chance to earn and save more than you would be able to at home — as well as access professional opportunities and experiences that can help you to fasttrack your career.

Home

In terms of a place to call your own, many expats live in secure gated communities in Saudi Arabia, traditionally known as compounds. The properties are usually furnished, spacious and well maintained.

When work's done, you can relax with friends, catch up with colleagues or socialize with neighbors. And living in these neighborhoods, you'll benefit from the strong sense of community and a range of on-site facilities, such as supermarkets, restaurants, cafés, gyms, tennis courts, swimming pools, cinemas, social clubs and playgrounds.

School

If you make the move with family, your children will attend a good-quality international school. These schools are typically co-educational. One likely change to their routine is that the school week runs from Sunday to Thursday. In addition, the school day may be shortened during Ramadan.

But their studies can stay the same, with international schools in Saudi Arabia covering the American, British, French and German curriculums, subject to where you attend.

In terms of the relocation itself, I received fantastic support from the AECOM team in Saudi Arabia. They helped me to find accommodation, process my visa and generally ensure that my mobilization was as hassle free as possible.

Healthcare

You'll also have access to good healthcare facilities, both public and private. You must have medical insurance in Saudi Arabia, and this will be provided by AECOM.

Travel

In Saudi Arabia, most people travel by car. This includes women who are now allowed to drive. Metro systems are also being developed in Jeddah and Riyadh, but are not yet in use.

Many expats hire a driver, with most compounds offering shuttle services.

Crucially, you'll have the full support of AECOM and your colleagues to help ensure that the transition to your life in Saudi Arabia is as seamless as possible for you and your family.

Relaxing with friends


If you're up for a round of golf, there's a host of greens for you to choose from, as well as plentiful sporting facilities and clubs to play team sports or help you keep fit.
